IGNITE: Liturgy & Worship Course

Course Description:

Worship stands at the center of the Christian life – as the point where God's people bring the whole of their lives to Christ with thanksgiving and receive edification and nourishment through the Word and Sacraments. Liturgy comprises the aspects of worship that enable and support this exchange through speech, action, and method.

This course will focus upon the Church's liturgy from a Lutheran perspective in relationship to the Bible, history, Church teachings, and leadership.

Rationale / Objectives:

- to deepen understanding of the Liturgy through biblical, historical, theological, and cultural influences within worship and the Christian life
- to deepen understanding of the Liturgy's structure and liturgical resources
- to gain insight into the churches / contexts in which we worship the Triune God
- to experience worship leadership as a presider, assisting minister, reader
